

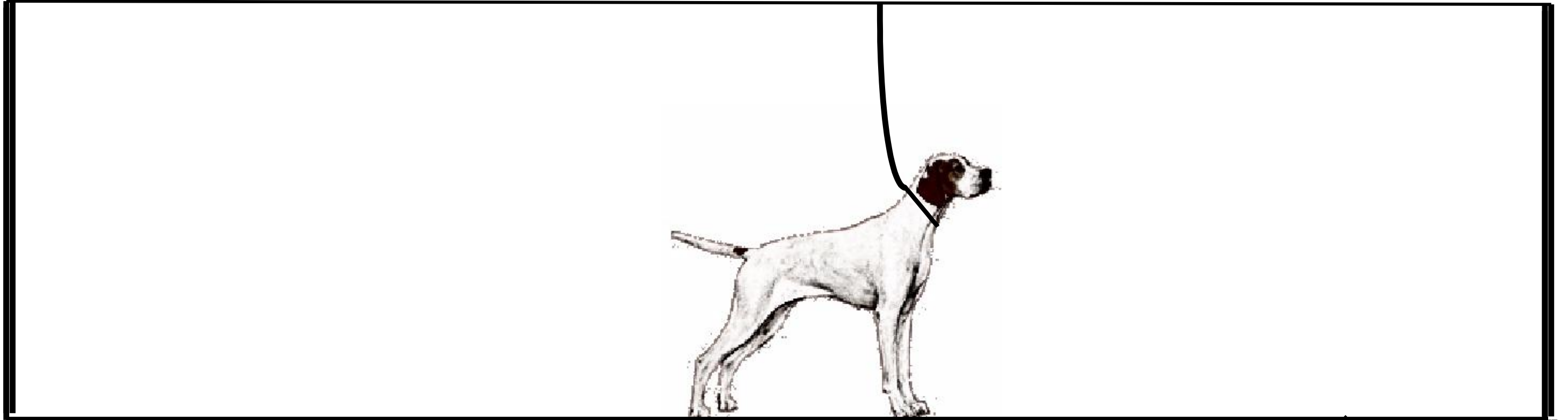
Reasons to train with the R&J's summer training group

- The circus of multiple dogs will help develop you're dogs "been there done that mentality"
- Time on the chain gang teaches a dog restraint and control
- Extra hands to handle dogs, birds are crucial to properly executed drills

Types of drills

 - The trained retrieve table
 - Backing drills
 - Walking bird drills

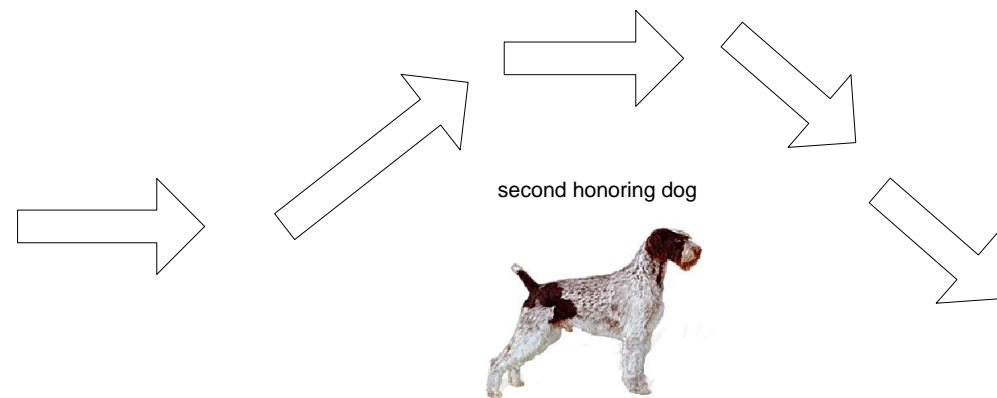
Trained Retrieve Table



- " Develop style
- " Work younger dogs on being steady
- " Work older dogs on staying relaxed
- " Train retrieve (force fetch)

third honoring dog



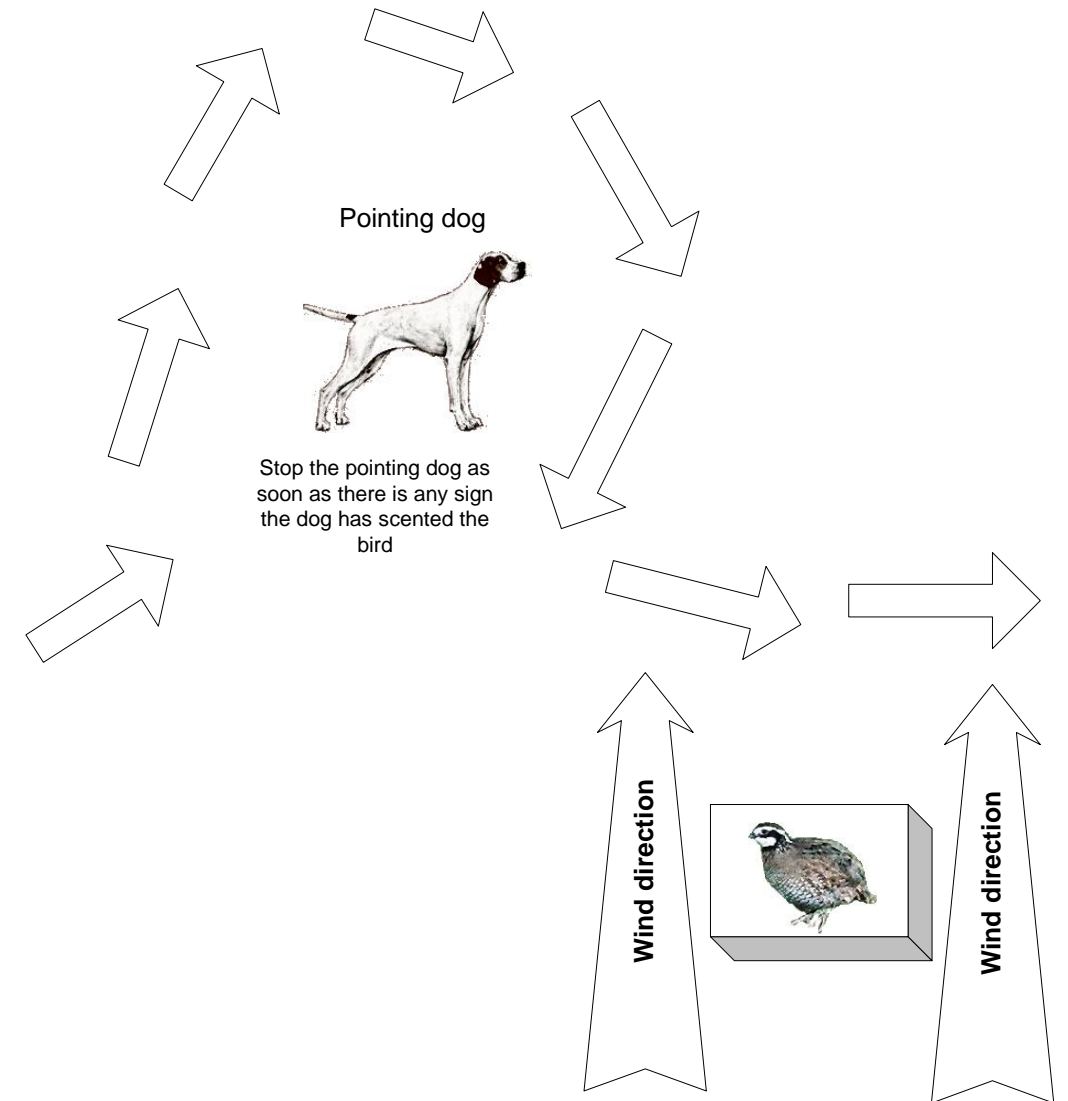
second honoring dog



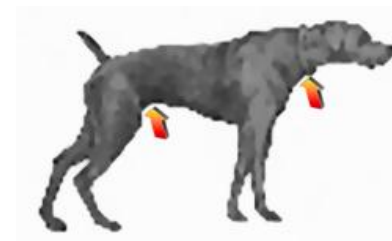
first honoring dog



Stop your "honoring" dog as soon as there is a clear line of site to ANY other dog that is stopped

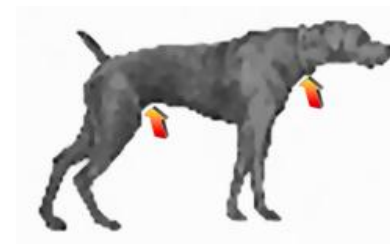
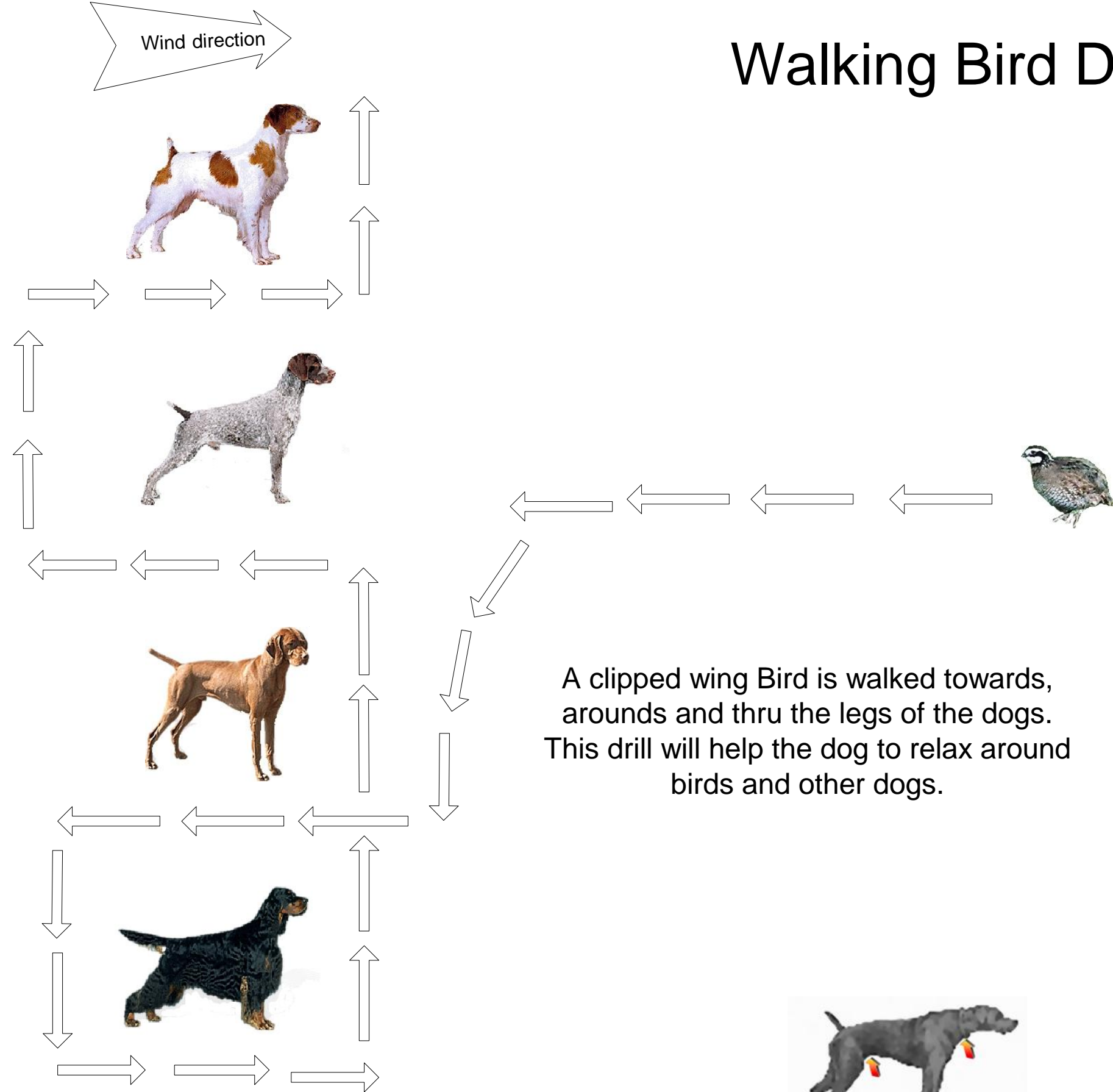


- "Pointing" dog is brought to the trapped bird & stopped as soon as there is any sign of scenting.
 - Signs of scenting:
 - Tail starts to wag
 - Tongue draws back in mouth
 - Head changes direction
 - Eyes change direction
 - Behavior changes in any way
- 1st Honoring dog is stopped as soon as there is a direct line of sight to the pointing dog or scent from bird is noticed.
- 2nd honoring dog is stopped as soon as there is a direct line of sight to ANY stopped dog.
- 3rd honoring dog is stopped as soon as there is any direct line of sight to ANY stopped dog.
- Once all dogs are stopped and handlers have control the bird is flushed , all dogs are made to stand using the point of contact on the flank (top of flank for flushing breeds)
- When all dogs are still the last honoring dog is released and brought through all the honoring dogs.
- Walk between the pointing dog and the location of the flushed bird
- 2nd to last honoring dog is released next
- Last honoring dog now becomes the "pointing dog" on the next planted bird



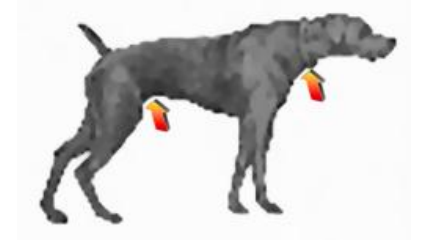
Remember - handle you're dog only where you want to create you're points of contact

Walking Bird Drill

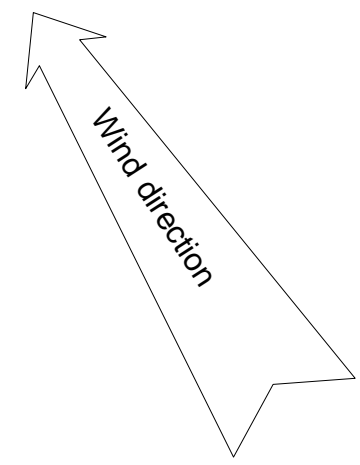
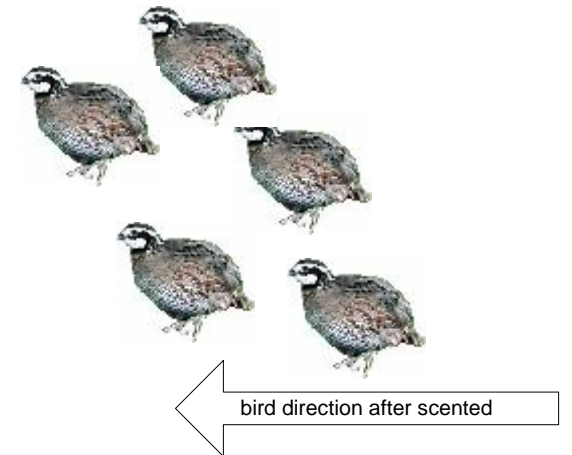
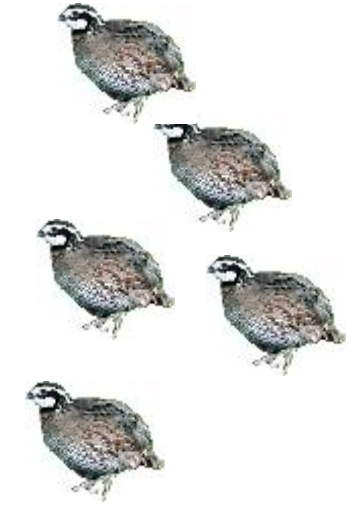
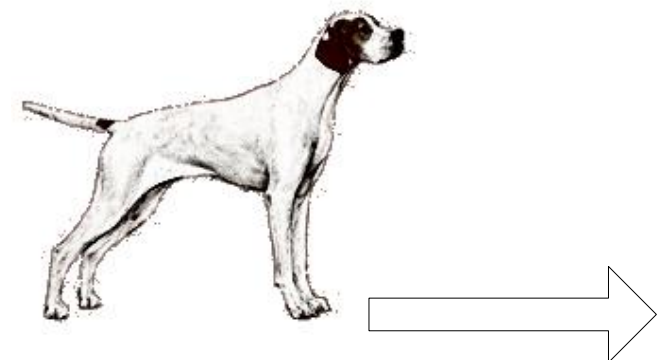
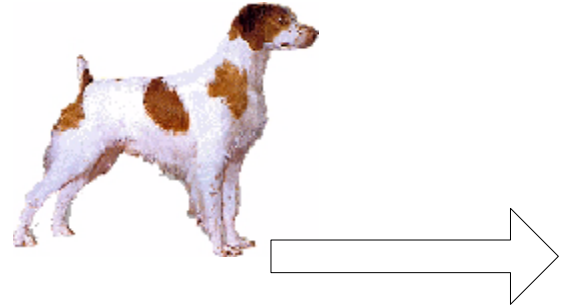
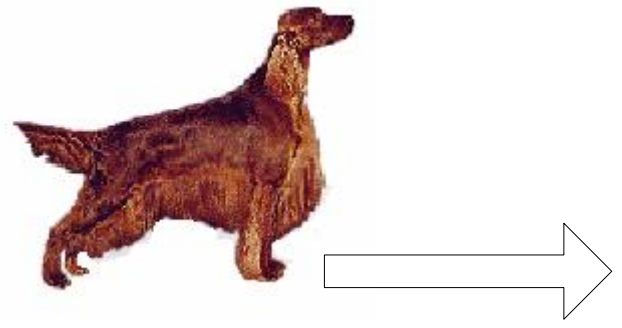


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Flushing line drill



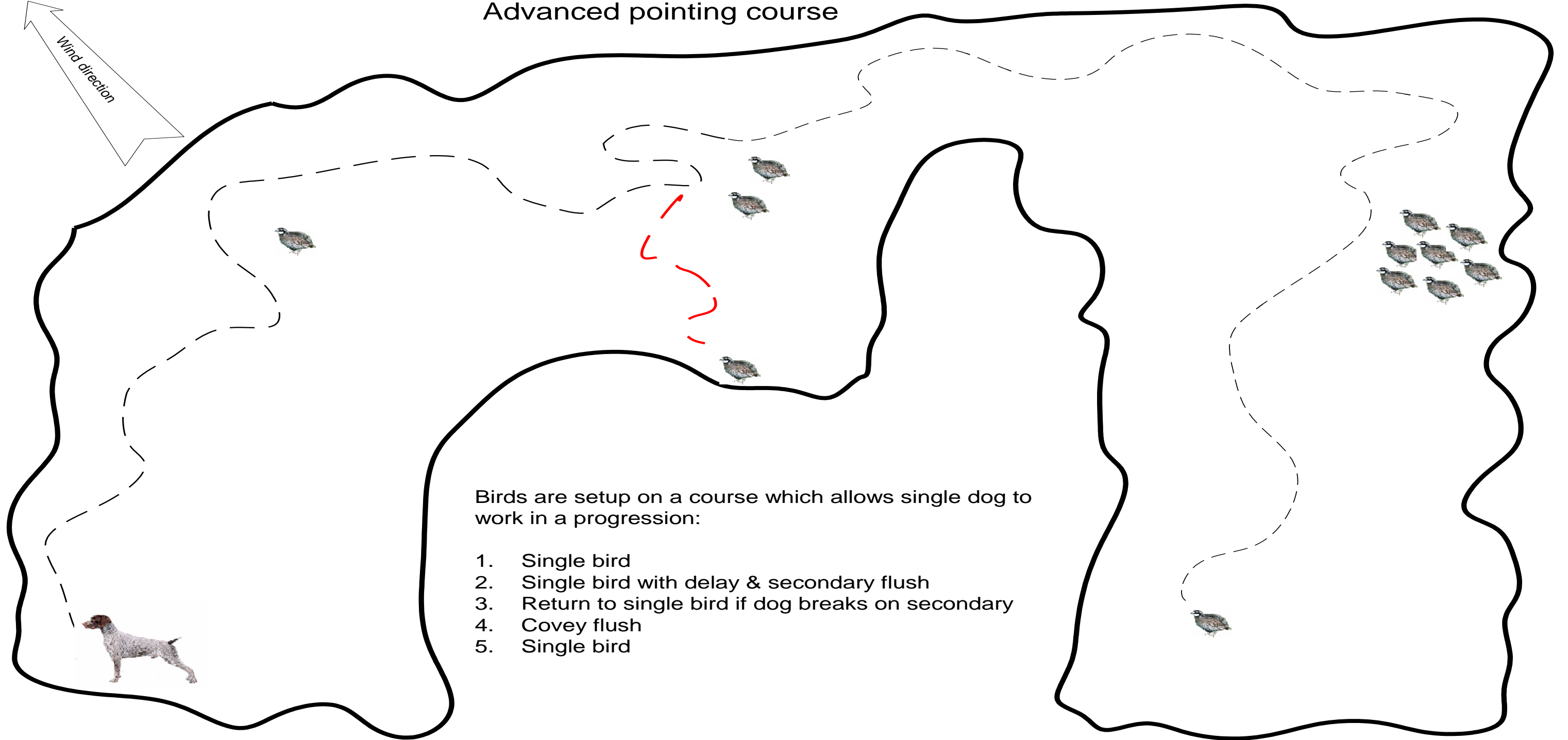
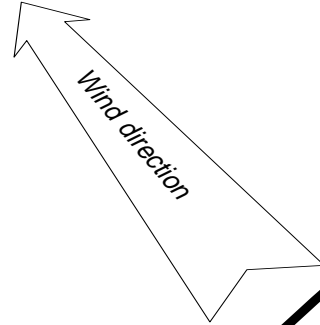
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Dogs are brought thru the field on 6' command lead. When any dog make scent as a group all dogs are brought to a stop.

Bird handler walks the birds past the dogs which are held on point until all birds flush or walk past the line of dogs.

Advanced pointing course



Birds are setup on a course which allows single dog to work in a progression:

1. Single bird
2. Single bird with delay & secondary flush
3. Return to single bird if dog breaks on secondary
4. Covey flush
5. Single bird
